We are in the homestretch! The Jean Bradbury Building (JBB) renovations are well into the second phase of construction and we are beginning to plan for the new space as a whole.

Construction on the first phase was completed in May. Shortly thereafter participants were moved from the East side of the building into the West side for the final stage. The transition went smoothly and everyone is ensconced on the completed side of the building, enjoying the bright new program areas and modern, therapeutic amenities. Our staff and the contractors have continued to take great care to ensure that disruptions and inconveniences have been kept to an absolute minimum for everyone that attends programs at JBB and I am incredibly grateful for their hard work. I am very excited to have this project completed and unveil the new Jean Bradbury Building in the coming months.

For phase two, we are doing much of the same as phase one while also making underutilized space ready for programs, classes, and relaxation areas for our participants. We are expecting that this phase will be completed sometime in September. After checking and re-checking our punch lists on the building, participants will likely have the building fully occupied shortly thereafter.
